No one wants to think about kids being homeless. No one wants to picture young faces and associate them with horrific reality. Sweet, syrupy fantasy is easier to swallow than hard, bitter reality. But homeless kids do exist; I exist.

Since I was young, my mother has struggled with addiction. Her choices and the consequences of her addiction directly affected me. We were homeless a lot. We stayed with family and friends at first, until my mother burned those bridges. But staying in shelters was the hardest. It's not easy to be a kid and be homeless. You worry what friends will think so you keep it hidden, so no one knows.

Being homeless made me ashamed and angry. Angry at my mother, angry at myself, angry at the world—and I lashed out in every way I knew how. Homelessness ate away at me until I no longer cared about anyone or anything, until I became hardened to life and the things that happened to me.

What I didn't realize then was that I shouldn't have been angry or ashamed, and what I realize now is that I am not less than others just because I was homeless.

Rachel's spirit is broken. Her mother failed her. Other adults in her life failed her. But YOU can help! This is the state of mind for most of the youth who come to Port in the Storm.
