
Tales of a foster kid

Kevin's story!

What's the first thing that comes to mind when you think of homelessness? A down-andout middle-aged person asking for change to buy liquor or drugs? Well, there is another less-visible population – teenagers leaving the foster care system.



Often, I am asked how it happened, where my support systems were.

At age 12, I was taken from my biological family because I was abused. This began a long list of foster homes. Not all of them were bad. I attended five different schools. But I graduated

> from high school. In the foster care world, a high school diploma is like a Ph.D. I hardly had any friends. Each time I got comfortable in a foster home, I had to leave. I hated my life. I never got a chance to be a kid. I know many foster kids have great families. But the truth is that once you reach 18 the party is over – it sure was for me.

Last week I met a couple of Street Outreach workers and they told me about Port in the Storm. So here I am. I know how lucky I am to be here. They tell me that people who don't even know me give money and food and everything to give us a future. Without you I don't have a chance.
